The meeting commenced at 7:00pm.

1. Welcome and Acknowledgement of Country

Catriona Booth, President of the APA, opened the meeting by welcoming everyone to the 2024 Annual General Meeting of the Ascham Parents Association. She hoped all families had settled into Term 1 and enjoyed a relaxing summer break with family and friends. She noted how wonderful it was to meet in person at the Margaret Bailey Building, and to have so many also joining online. Catriona extended a warm welcome to both new and returning families and those in year 12 for whom this might be their

final APA AGM. Catriona also thanked Head of School Andrew Powell, for leading the Blueprint Tour earlier in the evening, which provided an exciting glimpse into the future.

She acknowledged that the evening's meeting was being hosted from the land of the Gadigal people of the Eora Nation, the Traditional Custodians of the land. Catriona recognised their continuing association with land and waters and paid respect to Elders past, present and emerging, and extended that respect to all First Nations people present.

After outlining some key housekeeping matters, Catriona welcomed our speakers and special guests to the meeting: our Chair and Vice Chair of the School Committee, Sarah Poolman and Hazel Jackman; Head of School Andrew Powell; Head of Junior School Peta Howley; APA Treasurer Alex Hunter and the incoming APA Office Bearers.

2. Administrative Matters

Catriona introduced the formal part of the AGM and welcomed Rebecca Williams, APA Secretary, to run through the apologies and minutes of the prior meeting.

2.1. Apologies

Rebecca asked for any further apologies in addition to those already received prior to the meeting. No further apologies were noted.

2.2. Previous Minutes of 2023 AGM

Rebecca confirmed that the presentation and minutes of the 2023 AGM held on 8th February 2023 have been uploaded to the Hub and were distributed prior to the meeting. No questions arose.

Rebecca proposed the minutes of the 2023 AGM be approved. Jamie Vueti seconded the proposal, and Rebecca declared the motion to approve the minutes of the 2023 AGM carried.

3. Address by Chair and Vice Chair of the School Committee 2024, Sarah Poolman and Hazel Jackman

Sarah and Hazel introduced themselves and thanked the APA for the opportunity to speak at the meeting and expressed their excitement to be leading the student body together in 2024. They shared the Committee's goal this year which is to maintain and build upon a sense of community at Ascham and that the motto for the year is "*Making Moves in Brown Shoes*".

The motto serves two purposes, to encourage everyone to:

- feel comfortable walking in their own shoes
- step into other people's shoes.

The Committee believes these two elements are equally important in building a strong community. The motto was introduced to the Senior School in term 4 last year via a shoe auction which highlighted that while everyone has brown shoes, they are also emblematic of the students individuality and supportiveness in the Ascham community. All Committee Portfolios have now adopted the motto

They noted some early achievements in Term 4 2023, including:

- Head of Dalton – offered peer tutoring for year 7 to 10 exams during Tuesday lunchtimes to assist students with diary planning, homework and study tips
- Head of Sport – demonstrated the importance of a balanced lifestyle as well as building Ascham comradery in sport through evolving the motto to “*Making Moves in Sporting Shoes*” and introducing Sports Girl of the Week awards.
- Head of Co-curricular – worked hard to highlight the importance of engaging in co-curricular activities and recognised those girls who did exceptionally well
- Head of Charity – held multiple worthy fundraiser events since the Committee’s inauguration in term 4, including for Lou’s Place.
- Head of Drama – raised \$700 for the World Wide Fund for Nature during the Middle School production of *This Changes Everything*.

They noted planned focus areas for 2024, including:

- Engaging Fiona and Hillingdon in this year’s motto, with a vision to create a painted footprint mural or pathway of student footprints, to be completed by the end of the year
- All Committee portfolios to incorporate the motto into planned future initiatives.

Sarah and Hazel closed by expressing their desire for all Ascham students to be confident in their own shoes while also being supportive of others, leaving a footprint marking the small steps taken as they move towards creating and sustaining a better Ascham community.

Catriona thanked the girls for their address and wished them, along with the rest of the Year 12 cohort, every success for 2024.

4. Outgoing President’s Report, Catriona Booth

Catriona began her address noting that the past year was a busy one for the APA as life took on a more normal pace and the regular cadence of school activities resumed, providing more opportunities to interact as a community and to make many meaningful connections.

She thanked all the APA Committee members and volunteers for their flexibility, good humour and constant commitment throughout the year and noted that this time of year brings renewal for the APA as members of the Executive and broader Committee are farewelled. Catriona offered particular thanks to Briony Lee, VP for Middle School, while vacating this position, will continue as a Year Parent in 2024.

Catriona noted that her tenure as APA President is coming to an end along with the tenure of the other Office Bearers Jamie, Alex and Rebecca. She extended her thanks for their wise counsel, wonderful senses of humour, comradery, energy and extraordinary commitment to the APA.

Over the past three years, it has been a privilege for Catriona to work closely with Jamie, Alex and Rebecca to foster connection within our school community by finding ways to help parents and families engage through the various activities and events the APA arrange and host, and secondly to support families in need.

She provided some highlights from 2023, including:

- Welcoming new families to the school, hosting morning teas and cocktail parties for individual year groups.
- Donation of a slide to the new Hillingdon playground

- Contribution to a new LED scoreboard in the gym
- Supported the installation of a sculpture to commemorate the beloved fig tree
- Installed a sound system in the Margaret Bailey Gardens
- Supported the end of Senior School Color Run
- Supplied breakfast for all staff on World Teachers Day
- Supported the Ken Richard Tennis Prize
- Donations to several charities including Running for Premature Babies, Lou's Place, Black Dog Institute, Beyond Blue and Sydney Children's Hospital
- Prevented more than a tonne of textiles entering landfill through the 2nd hand uniform stalls

Catriona expressed gratitude for the opportunity to be President of the APA for the past three years and her pride in partnering with the Office Bearers as they worked together in fostering meaningful connections among all parents to create a strong sense of community. She also thanked the Ascham staff who have been a great help to the Executive and to the members of the APA committee, Year Reps and volunteers who give their time and commitment to the APA.

Catriona then invited Alex Hunter, APA Treasurer, to address the meeting and provide the Treasurer's Report for 2023.

5. Outgoing Treasurer's Report for 2023, Alex Hunter

Alex presented the Treasurer's Report for the year ended 31 December 2023. He noted that Nexia Australia had completed an independent review of the financials. He thanked the Ascham finance team for their assistance in this process of finalising the accounts, as well as throughout the year, which was greatly appreciated. A special thanks was given to Paul Chau for his ongoing support.

Alex presented a summary of the APA's 2023 Financial Statements, including the following highlights:

- total revenue for the year was \$338k, including \$337k from fundraising
- total expenses for the year were \$301k, which resulted in a surplus of \$37k
- total accumulated funds at the end of the financial year were \$217k (an increase of \$37k being the surplus previously mentioned).

Key items of income and expense over the year were presented. The largest contributors to revenue were year group functions at \$112k and the Second-Hand Uniform Pop-Ups continued to provide a strong source of funds for the association with \$51k, an increase of \$6k over the prior year. On the expense side the largest category was again year group functions, as well as the signature APA events (e.g. End of Year Cocktail Party, Mothers/Fathers Day Breakfasts etc).

The APA was also fortunate in 2023 to be able to provide some significant gifts and donations to the school and several charitable organisations, totalling \$83k, an increase of \$14k over the prior year. These gifts and donations included:

- \$3,805 to Running for Premature Babies (from Hillingdon/Fiona Mother's Day Breakfasts)
- \$4,310 to Fred Hollows Foundation (from Hillingdon/Fiona Father's Day Breakfasts)
- \$2,425 to Lou's Place (from Senior School Mother's Day Breakfast)
- \$1,811 to WEAVE (from Senior School Father's Day Breakfast)
- \$3,145 in gifts to others (including Ascham families in need)
- \$26,296 to Ascham Boarders Hardship Fund (from Tennis Day Boarder Raffle)
- \$37,223 for Hillingdon playground slide

(Summary slides of the APA's Financial Statements for the Year ended 31 December 2023 were presented at the meeting and are included as Appendix A to these minutes.)

As a final administrative matter, Alex proposed that the current auditors Nexia Australia be appointed to undertake the audit of the Ascham Parents Association financials for the 2024 financial year. The proposal was seconded by Rebecca Williams and the motion was passed.

Catriona thanked Alex for his update and again thanked the School's Finance department for their support throughout the year.

6. Election of Office Bearers & Committee for 2024

6.1. Election of Office Bearers for 2024

Catriona introduced the nominations for the APA Office Bearers, included in the 2024 AGM accompanying slides presented during the meeting, which were as follows:

- Madeleine Campbell - President
- Lizzy Perks - Vice President
- Barry Porter - Treasurer
- Colette McCue - Secretary

Catriona introduced Madeleine Campbell, as the nominee for APA President, noting her long association with Ascham as an Old Girl. Madeleine's daughter Evie is currently in Year 6, having joined Ascham in Kindergarten.

Lizzy Perks was then introduced as the nominee for APA Vice President, noting she is a child and adolescent psychologist and a PHD candidate at the University of Sydney. Lizzy has 2 daughters, Airlie in Year 5 and Elke in Year 7, both having started at Ascham in Hillingdon.

Following a show of hands, Catriona declared the motion to approve the election of the nominated Office Bearers carried and wished Madeleine, Lizzy, Barry and Colette every success in leading the APA in the coming years.

6.2. Election of New and Existing Committee Members for 2024

Following a show of hands, Catriona declared the motion to approve the election of the nominated Executive and General Committee Members for 2024 carried. She thanked all the Committee Members for agreeing to join the APA and expressed excitement to have them all on board for the upcoming year.

Catriona congratulated Madeleine on her election and invited her to Chair the remainder of the meeting as the newly elected President of the APA.

7. Incoming President's Report, Madeleine Campbell

Madeleine extended a sincere and grateful thanks to Catriona, Jamie, Alex and Rebecca for their extraordinary leadership of the APA over the prior three years and their success in fostering a cohesive community particularly through the period of COVID and lockdowns.

Their leadership transitioning the parent community back to in person events via a range of impressive initiatives including the Second-Hand Uniform Pop Up, Coffee

Mornings, Family Days across the entire school and the major yearly events including Tennis Day, Mother's and Father's Day Breakfasts and the Whole of School Drinks have been run successfully with enthusiasm, humour and grace.

Madeleine thanked the outgoing Office Bearers for leaving the APA in a flourishing state, noting that they have set the bar very high and offered extraordinary generosity with their time in helping with the transition of leadership to the incoming Office Bearers.

Madeleine introduced Barry Porter as the APA Treasurer, noting his extensive career in financial services, the last 15 of which has been working alongside his wife Jennifer in their financial planning practice. Their daughter April is currently in Year 7, having started at Ascham in Year 5.

Colette McCue was then introduced as the APA Secretary, noting her extensive career in management consulting and as an executive in pharmaceutical life sciences. Colette's daughter Ava is currently in year 6, having started at Ascham in Kindergarten.

Madeleine reiterated that the APA's focus is to foster connection and to contribute to the development of a happy and united school community, noting that the first large event of the year will be the Whole of School Drinks on Friday 8th March 2024, which has been expanded to include all parents and carers from Prep to Year 12. The Second-Hand Uniform Pop-Up will continue to operate twice per term, along with the annual Tennis Day, Mother's and Father's Day Breakfasts etc.

Madeleine extended thanks to all Ascham staff who have been extremely welcoming and helpful during the transition of leadership and thanked all APA Class and Year Representatives, the Executive and General Committees and volunteers who all give their time so generously. Any parent and carer interested in being involved in the APA, in whatever capacity, were strongly encouraged to step forward and contribute to the vibrant year ahead.

Madeleine then invited Head of School, Andrew Powell to address the meeting.

8. Address by Head of School, Andrew Powell

Andrew firstly congratulated Madeleine and the new Office Bearers on their election and thanked the outgoing Office Bearers for their significant contributions and time spent in their roles. He noted that it hasn't been an easy time over the past couple of years of disruption however the outgoing Office Bearers successfully brought together our Community with grace and good humour and have contributed in so many different ways, with hugely beneficial results.

The 2024 school year commenced with Ascham welcoming 118 boarders back to campus with 18 new boarders joining also, the largest number while Andrew has been Head of School. Total student numbers are 1,224 across the whole school, indicative of a strong enrolment pipeline.

The new year has brought some changes to senior school staff including Dr Joanne Manning assuming the role of Acting Deputy Head of School role while Pascale Drever is on long service leave. Catherine Clayton has returned as our Hillingdon Coordinator while Linda Cassar has taken up the role of Deputy Head of Junior School - Teaching and Learning. Tamarin Turner has continued in her role as Deputy Head of Junior School - Staffing and Operations.

The 2023 Year 12 cohort departed Ascham with wonderful honours and exceptional HSC results with Andrew noting:

- 8% of girls achieved an ATAR of ≥ 99
- 35% of girls achieved ATARs above 95
- 60% of girls achieved ATARs above 90
- in 631 of 652 examinations, students achieved marks of 70% or above
- 9 students were acknowledged on the All Rounders list, having achieved top bands of 90% or more in 10 or more units

He reiterated how wonderful the results were and thanked all the staff for the efforts they had put in to support the 2023 Year 12 cohort.

Andrew provided an overview of the Fiona building program planned for 2024 and beyond and encouraged all parents to undertake an upcoming Blueprint Tour if possible. Disruptions should be kept to a minimum throughout the building program. Plans for the redevelopment of 19 Darling Point Road are also progressing with DA submission expected later this year.

Andrew then provided an update on the status of Ascham School Strategic Plan: Towards 2030, initiated last year, sharing slides covering:

1. Our Purpose (*the Dalton difference now more than ever*);
2. Our Core Values (Respect and kindness - Collaboration and Community, Courage & Resilience – Acceptance, Responsibly, Ambition);
3. Our Graduate Attributes – generous collaborators, critical and agile thinkers, intrinsically motivated, and authentically confident.
4. Our Strategic Commitments:
 - i. Inspired Teaching & Learning
 - ii. Wellbeing for All
 - iii. Authentic Student Leadership
 - iv. A Culture of High Performance and Growth
 - v. Ascham Community – It's Your Place
 - vi. Sustaining our Future

Andrew noted that in 2024, focus areas will include:

- development of Dalton Committees in Junior School
- continuing development of teaching and learning framework in Junior School
- continuing to look at analysis of data to improve student learning
- homework review in Senior School in Years 7 to 10
- student well-being including youth mental first aid training for parents
- authentic student leadership including a Sisters in Leadership conference
- continuing to develop relationships with local boys schools
- establishing an Ascham Academy for Teachers
- enhancing sustainability projects

Andrew closed by thanking the APA for their ongoing support and expressed excitement for the year ahead.

Andrew then invited Head of Junior School, Peta Howley, to address the meeting.

9. Address by Head of Junior School, Peta Howley

Peta remarked that it was with great pleasure she was speaking this evening to provide an update on the Junior School. She shared some photographs from the first few days illustrating what a positive start to the year they were having in the Junior School, with much excitement and optimism on display for the year ahead.

She noted that the newly introduced Transitions Programs in Prep and Kindergarten have contributed to this positive start and that these Programs will continue to be developed further this year.

In addition to the staff changes in the Junior School, mentioned by Andrew, Peta noted that Michelle Baddams is working across P-6 in supporting Dalton initiatives and three new teachers have been welcomed this year also. There has also been some shifts in teaching staff between Hillingdon and Fiona. Michelle Fields has moved to Year 2, while Claire DeKany is now on Year 5 and Kate Le Heron is now on Year 4. These shifts promote and support professional growth and reinvigorate a sense of community and a more connected and cohesive culture across Hillingdon and Fiona.

Peta gave special thanks to APA Hillingdon VPs, Tania Madsen and Elizabeth Zahra for their support in welcoming new parents to Prep and Kindergarten at this week's welcome morning teas and noted that Year 5 parents will be welcomed tomorrow.

Peta shared that the implementation of the new English and Mathematics syllabus documents from K-6 has been a very important impetus to look at practices and programs and has been very conducive to looking at how we can continue to create program structures and processes that support student responsibility, independence, collaboration and reflection. A Dalton Committee is being established in the Junior School, with an initial focus on Prep and Kindergarten initiatives.

Finally, Peta thanked all parents for their continuing patience, good humour and adherence to car line guidelines while the Fiona Development continues.

10. Questions

With the conclusion of the formal presentations, Madeleine opened the meeting to any questions.

With no questions posed, Madeleine closed the meeting by thanking the speakers and those in attendance.

The meeting concluded at 7.45pm.
